The event was a great success. 70 International Alumni attended from all over the world representing 36 countries. Among the attendees were 27 current or retired General or Flag officers above the grade of O7.

This was a collaborative event with NDU's College of International Security Affairs (CISA), International Student Management Office (ISMO), and Africa Center for Strategic Studies (ACSS). The 2018 Global Summit was a great step for the university, moving towards building a more powerful and connected alumni network across all the colleges and maintaining inter-country connections formed at NDU.
