Interns should be able to demonstrate high levels of aptitude to take on responsibility and be capable of working independently and in group settings. Attention to detail is crucial to the work conducted in this office.

Most importantly, our interns must be aware that they are helping these foreign military officers understand America. We seek friendly, dedicated, motivated, and organized individuals. Foreign language proficiency, though not required, is also beneficial in an atmosphere with over 25 spoken languages.
