While the pandemic continues to strain each of our country's public health institutions and individual lives, we are grateful to you all for continuing to stay connected with the National Defense University. You,





# **NDU Course Updates**

#### College of Information and Cyberspace (Ft. McNair)

CIC is returning to delivering the Chief Information Officer Leadership Development Program (CIO-LDP) – a 14-week course focused on educating officers in ranks O4-O6 or civilian equivalent on the strategic use of information and information technology. All countries welcome to enroll on a first-come, first-served basis – 8 total seats. The first class is beginning in early January; a second is likely to be offered in August 2022!

#### Joint Forces Staff College (Norfolk, VA)

JFSC will open a **new** two-week in-residence course called the Joint Command, Control, Communications, Computers, and Intelligence/Cyber Course (JC4I Cyber) for Australia, Canada, New Zealand, and the United Kingdom. The first class will begin in October 2022. TS/SCI clearance is required and is open to O1-O6, CW4-6, and E6-E9 ranks. Best for those in Intel, Information Operations, Cyber, and Command and Control billets.

JFSC's Joint Combined and Warfighting School (JCWS), a 12-week course on joint operational planning, is returning to being an in-residence program on 3 January 2022 after a long hiatus in distance learning format due to the pandemic.
