You can visit the tree all month!

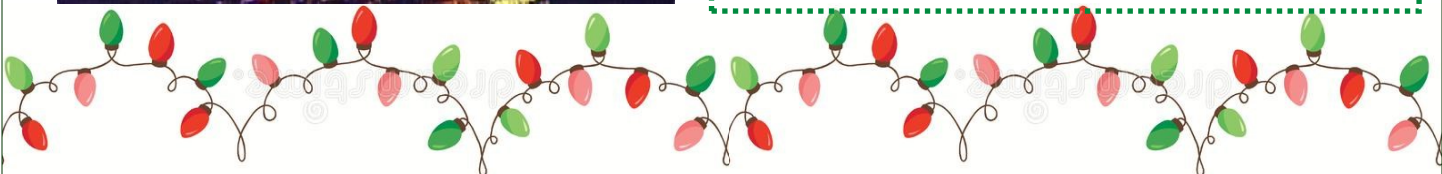
Georgetown Glow DC

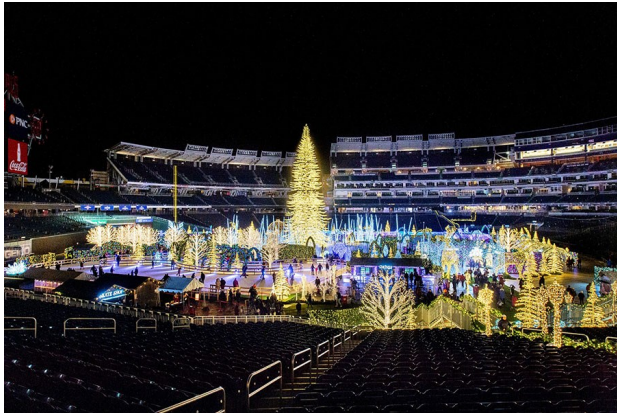
