Your role in the program

Your role as a sponsor can take many forms and cover a wide range of responsibilities. Although ISMO will provide assistance in most transition items such as banking, schools, housing and medical needs. The sponsor serves as a force multiplier to provide additional, in-depth assistance. Sponsors answer questions about U.S. culture, customs, local shopping and activities.

There are also certain standard expectations for all sponsors. Sponsors need to make contact with their Fellow by phone or e-mail, shortly after receiving their Fellows contact information. Sponsors should meet face to face with their Fellow at least once a month. When eating with the Fellow, sponsors should understand their IF's basic food requirements as dictated by religious/cultural tradition and dietary restrictions. Be willing to explain and learn about each other's cultures in a respectful manner. Finally, ISMO encourages you to attend as many NDU sponsor program events as possible.
