### **MUSEUMS**

Most museums require scheduling a visit ahead of time, however some release extra tickets the day of, check out the museum's website for more information

Below is a short list of only a few of the museums that are opening again. Check out the complete list here.

#### The National Archives

The Rotunda of the National Archives Building in Washington, DC, will open for viewing of the Declaration of Independence, U.S. Constitution, and Bill of Rights with limited capacity from 10 am to 2 pm on Friday through Monday. On July 2nd the Rotunda will be open daily from 10 AM to 5:30 PM. Admission is free. More info here!

#### The United States Holocaust Memorial Museum

The US Holocaust Memorial Museum teaches millions of people each year about the dangers of unchecked hatred and the need to prevent genocide. The museum is adjacent to the National Mall. #### The Smithsonian's National Zoo

The National Zoological Park, commonly known as the National Zoo, is one of the oldest zoos in the United States. Admission is free. More info here!

#### George Washington's Mount Vernon

Mount Vernon is an American landmark and former plantation of George Washington, the first President of the United States, and his wife, Martha. #### Smithsonian Gardens & Hirshhorn Sculpture Garden

The Smithsonian Gardens, a division of the Smithsonian Institution, is responsible for the "landscapes, interiorscapes, and horticulture-related collections and exhibits", which serve as an outdoor extension of the Smithsonian's museums and learning spaces in Washington, D.C. The Hirshhorn Museum and Sculpture Garden is an art museum beside the National Mall. No tickets needed! More information here.


#### **Activities**
