The National Archives

The Rotunda of the National Archives Building in Washington, DC, will open for viewing of the Declaration of Independence, U.S. Constitution, and Bill of Rights with limited capacity from 10 am to 2 pm on Saturdays and Sundays starting 15 May, and including Monday, 31 May. The United States Holocaust Memorial Museum

The US Holocaust Memorial Museum teaches millions of people each year about the dangers of unchecked hatred and the need to prevent genocide. The museum is adjacent to the National Mall. Extra tickets are released everyday at 11 am. Admission is free. More info <u>here</u>!

The Smithsonian's National Zoo

The National Zoological Park, commonly known as the National Zoo, is one of the oldest zoos in the United States. Admission is free. More info <u>here</u>!

George Washington's Mount Vernon

Mount Vernon is an American landmark and former plantation of George Washington, the first President of the United States, and his wife, Martha. The estate is on the banks of the Potomac River in Fairfax County, Virginia . Admission is \$28 for adults. Book your tickets <u>here</u>!

Smithsonian Gardens & Hirshhorn Sculpture Garden

The Smithsonian Gardens, a division of the Smithsonian Institution, is responsible for the "landscapes, interiorscapes, and horticulture-related collections and exhibits", which serve as an outdoor extension of the Smithsonian's museums and learning spaces in Washington, D.C. The Hirshhorn Museum and Sculpture Garden is an art museum beside the National Mall. No tickets needed! More information <u>here</u>.

The Return of the Cicada

Billions of cicadas that have been underground since 2004 have begun to emerge en masse and will blanket parts of the eastern United States with their song and, even-

How many?

There is predicted to be about one million cicadas per acre. This would mean about 25 or 30 cicadas per square foot. Watch wear you step!

Why are they so loud?

The high-pitched song is actually a **mating call** belted out by males. Each species has its own distinctive song that only attracts females of its own kind. This allows several different species to coexist.

Are they harmful?

No. Cicadas cannot hurt you. They do not bite or sting. They are only above ground to mate and reproduce until they go below ground again for 17 years.
